

DETAILED TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE CONSULTANCY TO CONVERT PROGRAM TRAINING MATERIALS INTO NATIONAL E-LEARNING CONTENTS.

The COVID-19 pandemic has affected human life at different levels and is still a tremendous challenge for all sectors. To respond and continue coping with the pandemic effects on health education, online teaching and learning have been crucial and continue to be promoted, which is also in alignment with the country's digitalization plan implemented across different sectors.

E-learning has numerous benefits including but not limited to being cost-effective, the capacity to reach many people in a short time and limited resources. and the capacity to be accessed through a range of different devices (computers, telephones, tablets). Additionally, it ensures consistency of training materials across trainings, it promotes collaboration, and can contribute to bridge the current gap in continuous learning.

CHAI, through the Ministry of Health/ Rwanda Biomedical Center is supporting the Government of Rwanda in strengthening digital health initiatives including digitalization of training materials for both pre-and-on service training of healthcare workers.

In this framework, CHAI is looking to hire a consultant to support ongoing e-learning projects.

1. Responsibilities:

- Revise developed teaching materials (slide decks, assessment tools)
- Adopt the populated e-learning template eg: storyboard
- Convert teaching materials into online content and upload the content in the national e-learning platform
- Arrange and facilitate the validation meeting/ workshops and present the process/ status for each course
- Provide expertise in the design of online content to ensure user-friendliness and easy access for learners.
- Pilot the courses and incorporate feedback from end users/ trainees.
- Train subject matter experts on navigating the platform for each course



• Train subject matter experts on navigating the platform for each course for future reviews.

- Proven experience working with the Ministry of Health on similar projects
- Ability to ensure inclusive education (using different teaching methodologies)
- Fluent in English, and Kinyarwanda



3. Deliverables:

- An inception report detailing the review adjustment process and md methodological approach and timeline for converting the materials into online content.
- Validation workshops and incorporate the feedbacks team
- Second version of the materials with feedback incorporated
- Conducting training for subject matter experts
- Piloting each course and adjusting.
- Submit the final report with the link for each course
